Martha and Charles House have lived in Hacienda Heights for over 40 years and are two of its finest citizens. They have been happily married for 44 years and have one daughter Marquita and a granddaughter, Markysha. They are the co-founders of the Puente Hills Concerts in the Park Program. During the summer music is provided each week free of charge to the community at Schabarum Park. Charles serves as Chairman of the Board and Martha as President, and they have done this together since 1995. Martha and Charles also serve on the Board of Directors for the Greater La Puente Valley Meals on Wheels Program that serves 11 communities. This program provides hot meals to those confined to their homes. In many cases, these are the only hot meals and visitors they receive each week.

Martha served two terms on the Mt. San Antonio Community College Board from 1993 to 2001, serving two terms as President, where she provided leadership and guidance to one of the finest community colleges in the United States. She served as a Presidential Elector in 2004 and was appointed as a delegate to the first White House Conference on Aging in 2005. She held many positions in the Republican Party over the years at both the county and local levels including being a current member to the Republican Central Committee. She volunteered or chaired regional campaigns for both President Bush's, Ronald Reagan, Bob Dole, Dan Lundgren, Matt Fong and Pete Wilson. She has served on the National, State and Local Federation of Republican Women. She has received numerous Woman of the Year and Woman of Achievement Awards from the 4th Supervisorial District, the 34th Congressional District, Southern California Edison, American Association of University Women, Daughters of the American Revolution, San Gabriel Valley Y.W.C.A, and the Chamber of Commerce to name just a few. Martha is a graduate of University of Redlands where she majored in Accounting.

Charles proudly served his country in the U.S. Army and was honorably discharged in 1960. He then served 27 years with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department in such areas as Patrol, Fraud Investigation, Operations Planning, and International Liaison with foreign consultants. He was awarded as one of Ten Outstanding Law Enforcement Officials of Los Angeles County. Charles is currently a Commissioner for the L.A. County Commission for Public Social Services and he serves on the Board of the Whittier Community Hospital. In 1996 Governor Wilson appointed Charles to the Narcotic Addict Evaluation Authority, a parole board, to evaluate drug addicts for parole where he served until 2000. He served as an Ex-Officio member of a Human Relations Commission in the City of Azusa. Charles served on the White House Delegation to monitor the first, free democratic election in El Salvador in 1989. Charles was also nominated by President George H.W. Bush to be the Director of the Office of Victims of Crime in 1990.

In Charles' free time he has been a volunteer fundraiser for the American Heart Association, President of the Hacienda Heights Lions and Toastmaster's International Clubs. He has received such honors as Service to Mankind Award by the Sertoma Club, Citizen of the Year by the Greater La Puente Valley Chamber of Commerce, Lion of the Year, Volunteer of the Year by the American Heart Association, to name just a few. Charles received his A.A. Degree from Los Angeles Metropolitan College and his B.S. from the California State University, Long Beach majoring in Accounting with a minor in Spanish.

In honor of their long standing service to the community and to the parade they are this years "Honorary Grand Marshals" of the "I Love America" Parade. Their families will be representing them in the parade.



Barbara Lee Fish moved to California in 1967 with her husband, Ronald, and their children Ron, Toni, and Lori. Barbara went back to school for her degree and worked fulltime. After retirement, she became involved in community service. A life member of Hacienda Heights Improvement Association, she was the President for five years and chaired numerous committees. Barbara represents Hacienda Heights as a Board member on the Native Habitat Preservation Authority, appointed by the Board of Supervisors. She is an Alternate Board Member on the Wildlife Corridor Conservation Authority. Hacienda Heights Woman's Club, American Heart Association, Friends of the Library and her first love, the Parade Committee, are groups she has served as a volunteer. Landfill issues took much of her time and many of the "grants" now coming to Hacienda Heights are the efforts of the committee members who worked to keep Hacienda Heights "A Good Place to Live". Charles "Bud" Welch was our 2008 4th of July Parade Grand Marshal and sadly we lost him this past year. He will always be known for community service and his rides down the parade on his horse. Bud was one of the founding members of the parade committee and for this we salute him. Below is only a portion of the community activities he was a part of over his life. Bud's family (wife Marilyn and daughters Kim and Cynthia and three grand daughters Taylor, Ashley and Morgan) is riding in today's parade in his honor and we have named the Equestrian Trophy in his honor.



Bud was born and raised in the small town of Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio. He and his parents moved to Downey, Ca. in the year 1951. Six months later, his Naval Reserve Unit was called to active duty and he spent 2 years in Korea and Japan with Naval Task Force 77. 




