IN HONOR OF OUR NATIONAL AND COMMUNITY HEROES

The Community of Hacienda Heights and the 4th of July Parade Committee would like to commemorate the 10th anniversary of the attack on the World Trade Center and the Pentagon on September 11, 2001. We salute the men and women who unselfishly put their lives on the line and came to the aid of those in peril. In addition, we would like to honor our own community heroes: The **Los Angeles County Fire Department, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, California Highway Patrol, and the HLPUSD Police Department.** We thank these men and women for serving Hacienda Heights.

Los Angeles County Fire Stations 43, 91, and 118 serve the Hacienda Heights community. **Angel Montoya** is the Assistant Fire Chief for unincorporated Hacienda Heights. When not responding to emergency calls, these stations provide public education on fire safety in schools, local businesses, and at community events. Firefighters from **Station 118** dedicate their time to the **Explorer Program** which offers young men and women the opportunity to learn about careers as firefighters. **Station 118** is the headquarters for the **East Regional Operational Bureau.** **Deputy Chief Michael Bryant**, an alumnus of Los Altos High School is assigned to the 118. **Station 43** is home to one of the Fire Department's four **Hazardous Material Units.** These firefighters receive specialized training in commercial and industrial incidents involving chemicals in solid, liquid, or gas form. **Station 91** is equipped with an Engine and Patrol Vehicle that patrols residential and rural brush areas. A few members of the Department's **Urban Search and Rescue (USAR)** are currently assigned to stations in the area. **USAR** members travel worldwide to assist in disaster recovery efforts, such as the earthquakes in Haiti, New Zealand, and Japan.



The **Industry Sheriff's Station** serves the unincorporated area of Hacienda Heights. **Captain Michael R. Claus** has approximately 150 sworn personnel under his command and there are twenty reserve deputies who are assigned to the Industry Station. **Detectives** at the Industry investigate a wide variety of crimes. The **Narcotics Team** handles drug cases and the **Operation Safe Streets Unit** deals with gangs. The **Explorer Program** is the largest in Los Angeles County with about sixty Explorers who assist with parade operations, along with the **Volunteers on Patrol.** **Deputy Brian Sanford** is currently the **Town Sheriff** for Hacienda Heights and we thank him for the assistance he provides in helping with our parade every year.



The **Santa Fe Springs CHP Area Office** serves the unincorporated communities of Hacienda Heights, Rowland Heights, West Whittier, and East Whittier. Because of the vast area of coverage, the Santa Fe Springs Area office is one of the busiest offices in California. **Captain Dan Minor** has approximately 114 sworn personnel under his command. The **Santa Fe Springs Area Office** is highly committed to providing the best safety and service to the public. Their effort is evident in assisting the great community of Hacienda Heights with its annual 4th of July Parade. **Officer Al Perez** is a member of the Parade Committee and we thank him for all the work he does in helping coordinate for the safety of this event.



The **Hacienda La Puente Unified School District Police Department** is dedicated to serving the Board of Education, school employees, students, and parents in the communities of Hacienda Heights, La Puente and Valinda. Its primary function is to provide a safe learning environment for our students and staff. **Chief Anthony Argott's** officers work directly with students, parents, and staff members and monitor campuses on foot and in patrol cars. The police department consists of a Chief of Police and Safety, one dispatcher, five fully-sworn police officers, three senior security officers, and thirteen campus security officers. **Officer Robert Barba** currently represents the H.L.P.U.S.D. on the 4th of July Parade Committee.

ROMPER ROOM

Romper Room was seen each weekday morning on station KCOP channel 13. For ten years, Mary Ann King “romped” through five daily live episodes of the *Romper Room* television show. It was the Kindergarten of television, reaching into thousands of homes and preparing preschoolers for “big” school.

“It was an absolute joy and delight to walk into the studio each morning and wonder what will come out of the mouths of these marvelous four- and five-year old youngsters. Every day was different. We may have had a policeman with his motorcycle. A baby deer with a chance for the children to hold its bottle. We even milked a cow and had a chance to taste fresh milk. We saddled a horse. We hatched eggs. We took ‘Space Rides’ in a dental chair while learning about dental health. The children helped plant a tree for Arbor Day. To see the children use their imaginations was just beautiful. They could easily become a galloping horse, a monkey swinging in a tree, or even ride on a rocket going to the moon. They never ceased to amaze me and I loved them, every one.”

Romper Room originated in Baltimore, Maryland in 1953 with Miss Nancy Claster as the first teacher. It was telecast in eighty-two cities in the United States and thirty-eight foreign countries. Miss Mary Ann hosted the Romper Room show for the “Do Bees” of Southern California. She is a graduate of the University of Oklahoma. She started with the Romper Room organization in Wichita, Kansas and accepted the position in Hollywood, California in 1966. Mary Ann King has been a resident of Hacienda Heights for forty-two years. She has been the voice of our July 4th “I Love America” Parade since it began in 1988.

Janet grew up in Elmhurst, Illinois. She earned her B.A. and teaching credential at Northern Illinois University in DeKalb, Illinois. Her first position was as the only female member of the faculty at all-boys Fenwick High School in Oak Park, Illinois.

Janet met her husband Tom at a reception in South Bend, Indiana. He is a Whittier native who attended Notre Dame Law School after undergraduate studies at Whittier College. Upon completion of law school, the newlyweds moved here to be near his new law practice in Whittier. They raised their children Jennifer, Chip, Amanda and Joey in Hacienda Heights.

Writing has always been a major part of Janet's personal and professional life. She served on yearbook and newspaper staffs as a student in high school and college, was journalism advisor in her teaching positions, volunteered to advise at local schools, and wrote hundreds of newsletters for various clubs.

Community activism was a cornerstone of Janet's life in Hacienda Heights. She is a lifetime member of the Hacienda Heights Improvement Association, Secretary for the 1975-78 Planning Advisory Committee that wrote the 1978 General Plan, member of the 2011 General Plan committee, Secretary of the Hacienda La Puente Arts Foundation, member of the Puente Hills Republican Women Federated, and an active member of past Hacienda Heights Cityhood efforts.

Janet also contributed her time and talents to local organizations. She was president of the Bishop Amat Parent Association, president of St. Bruno School Board, Chairperson of St. John Vianney Women's Guilds, Secretary of St. John Vianney Parish Council, President of Writers Club of Whittier, Girl Scout leader for eight years, and avid fan at many years of Highlander Little League games.

Janet thanks the Kiwanis Club and local residents for today's honor. She wishes to thank all those who contributed column stories and helped to spread the good news about Hacienda Heights. She encourages everyone to continue to support their local newspapers that publish the all-important local news.

Yes, she will greatly miss the beautiful California warmth and sunshine when those infamous Midwestern snow storms blow through Woodstock!



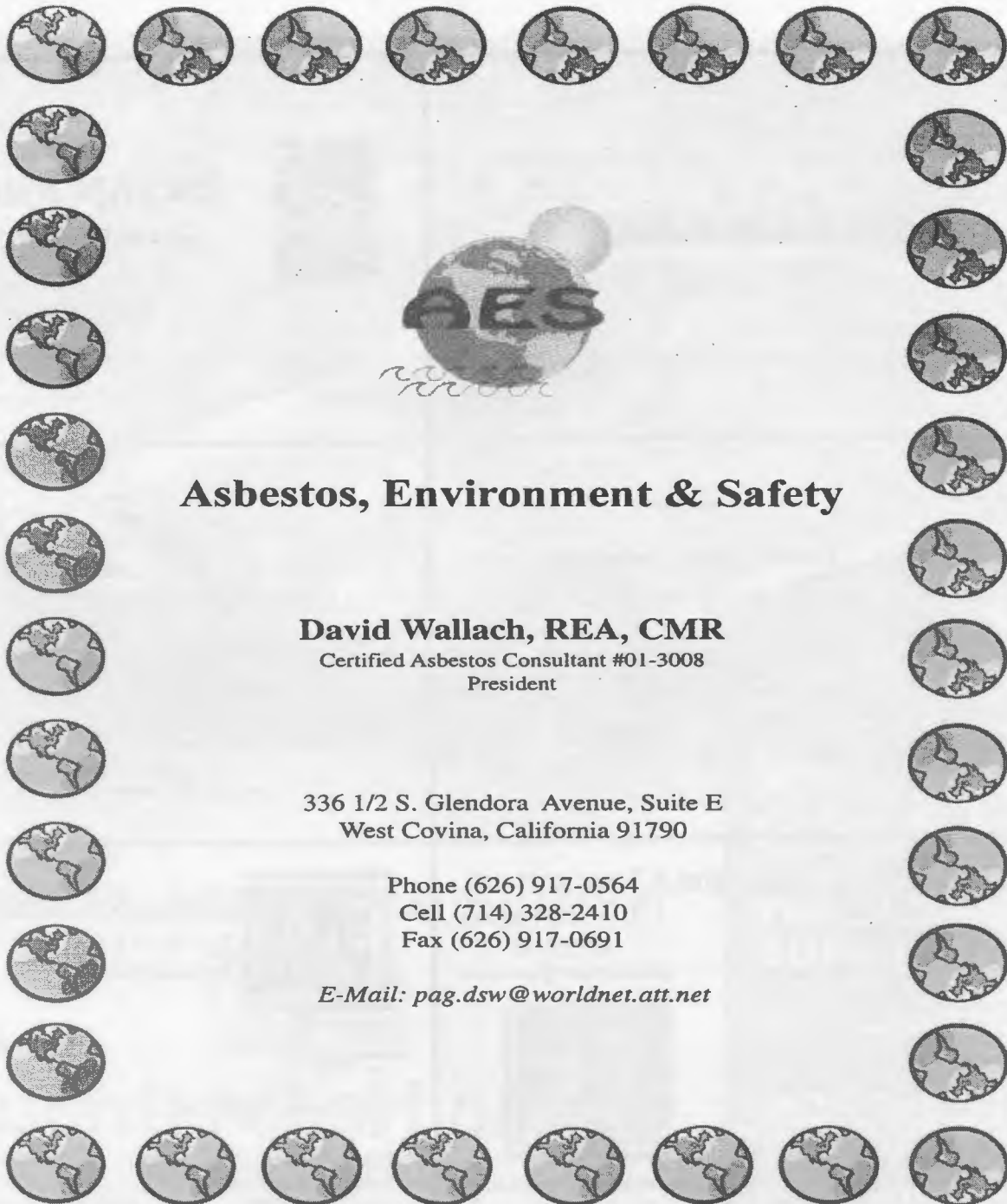

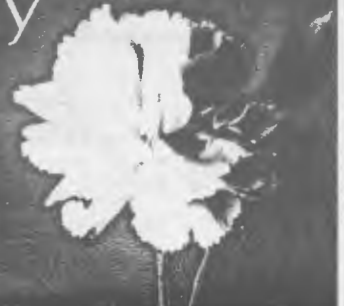
