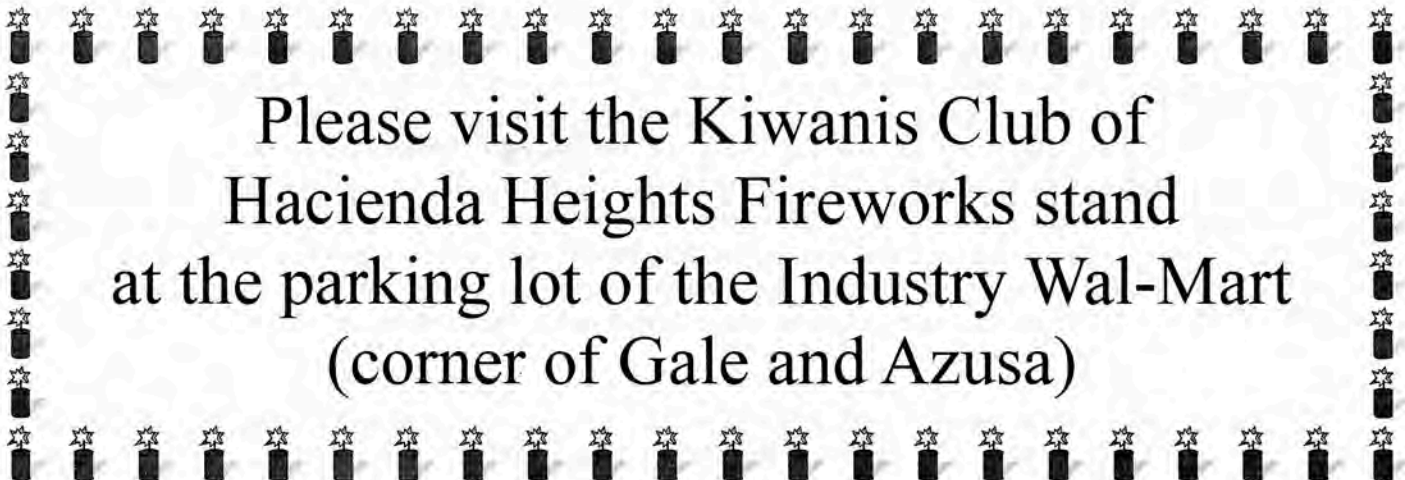

Scott Duncan

Scott Duncan retired from the Hacienda La Puente Unified School District on May 21, 2015, after 39 years of service to the community. He has a B.A. in Sociology and Physical Education, and M.A. in Education Administration. His most notable contribution to the community is the Orange Grove Law Enforcement Academy (OG LEA) and Police Explorer program that he founded after the terrorist's attack on 9-11. It's the only school-based Police Explorer program (HLP School Police) in the nation. Explorers uphold the following core values: "I commit myself to respect the dignity of all people; integrity to do right and fight wrongs; discipline in my academics and physical fitness; equity for everyone I encounter; and serving my country and community with honor." They observe and practice military courtesies, study the Administration of Justice, serve with police officers on patrol, at District events, and as honor and color guards at patriotic events. Explorers are expected to maintain a 3.0 to 4.0 GPA. OG LEA graduates are in college, serving in the military, law enforcement, or the private sector.

Scott learned about enterprise, perseverance, and public service at a young age. He knew his paternal great-grandfather, a farmer and small businessman who traveled by wagon from Missouri to California in the 1880s and homesteaded in Old Town Puente. The Duncan family worked in the family business, the old Puente Hardware Store, and devoted over 90 years of service to the school district. His father Chester Duncan (Puente Union High School '46) served on the school board and as Director of Purchasing for the old Hudson School District and HLPUSD. His mother Jeanene Duncan (85 years old) worked at the District office with Dr. Nakaoka for many years. And his sister Kathy (RN) and brother Dale (CPA) also served in the District.

Scott was captain of the 1968 LPHS Varsity Football Team. He was being processed for a Congressional appointment to the Naval Academy when he was given a pass to stand on the sidelines of a Mount San Antonio College football game on a Saturday night. While driving on Valley Blvd. to Mt. SAC, he was the victim of a 60 mph head-on collision caused by a drunk driver. The impact ejected Scott from car and it rolled over on top of him causing critical internal injuries: crushed chest; 9 fractured ribs; fractured shoulder; punctured and collapsed lung; massive internal bleeding; and a severe concussion. Scott miraculously survived the injuries that disqualified him from military service. He experienced an epiphany that motivated him to work even harder to serve the needs of others. After a long recovery, he was awarded a scholarship from Whittier College. While studying for his bachelor's degree and playing football, he worked as a part-time Emergency Medical Technician for L.A. County Emergency Medical Services. He was recruited into law enforcement, completed Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) certification at the Rio Hondo College Police Academy in 1972, and served as a Montebello Police Reserve Officer. He has experienced everything from the cradle to the grave: delivered a baby on an RTD bus; responded to suicides, aggravated assaults, grand theft auto, car accidents, gunshot wounds, stab wounds, and heart attacks. And he assisted detectives who investigated the murder of Montebello Police Officer Henry Acuna, shot by a suspect during an armed robbery in 1972.

Scott continues to serve the greater community and his country after retirement. He's a consultant for the OG LEA program, Monterey Park Police Explorers, and the U.S. Naval Sea Cadet Corps.

Romper Room was seen each weekday morning over station KCOP channel 13. For ten years Mary Ann King “romped” through five daily live editions of the Romper Room television show. It was the Kindergarten of television reaching into thousands of homes preparing the pre-schooler for his or her venture into “Big” school.

“It was an absolute joy and delight to walk into the studio each morning and wonder what will come out of the mouths of these marvelous four and five year old youngsters. Every day was different. We may have had a policeman with his motorcycle. A baby deer with a chance for the children to hold it’s bottle. We even milked a cow and had a chance to taste fresh milk. We saddled a horse. We hatch eggs. We took “Space Rides” in a dental chair while learning about dental health. The children helped plant a tree for Arbor Day. To see the children use their imaginations was just beautiful. They could easily become a galloping horse, a monkey swinging in a tree or even ride on a rocket going to the moon. They never ceased to amaze me and I loved them every one.”

Romper Room originated in Baltimore Maryland in 1953 with Miss Nancy Claster as the first teacher. It was telecast in 82 cities in the United States and 38 foreign countries. Miss Mary Ann hosted the Romper Room show for the “Do Bees” of Southern California. She is a graduate of the University of Oklahoma. She started with the Romper Room Organization in Wichita, Kansas and accepted the position in Hollywood California in 1966. Mary Ann King has been a resident of Hacienda Heights for 46 years. She has been the voice of our July 4th “I Love America” parade since it began in 1988 until 2014.
