Grand Marshals 2019 Charles and Martha House



CHARLES M. HOUSE

Charles House was born in Austin, Texas, and moved with his family to Boyle Heights when he was six years old. It was in the culturally rich and diverse East Los Angeles Community that Charles learned that every person, based on individual merit, could excel in his/her chosen endeavor. Charles graduated from Roosevelt High School and served in the U.S. Armed Forces in Fort Benning Georgia. Charles and his wife Martha have resided in Hacienda Heights since 1969. They are involved in community and church activities.

Charles House earned a bachelor's degree from California State University at Long Beach with a major in Accounting and a minor in Spanish. He furthered his studies of the Spanish language in Mexico and Guatemala.

Charles House served on the Narcotics Addict Evaluation Authority Commission appointed by Governor Wilson from January of 1996-2000. He has also served as the Executive Director for the Republican Party of Los Angeles County from August of 1994 to April 1996. Prior to that he served twenty-seven and half years with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department retiring with the rank of sergeant.

Charles House was named outstanding law Enforcement Officer in the San Gabriel Valley by the San Gabriel Valley Human Relations Committee in 1984. The Los Angeles Damayan Lions Club also honored Charles as one of the ten (10) outstanding law Enforcement Officers of Los Angeles County in 1985.

Charles House was appointed by President Bush to the White House Delegation that was sent to El Salvador to monitor the first, democratic, free, Presidential elections in 1989. He was also the Republican nominee for Congress in California's 34th district in 1986 and 1988 and won a City Council race in 1992 and 2002 in an unsuccessful effort to incorporate Hacienda Heights.

Charles House was nominated by President Bush in 1990 and 1991 to serve as Director of the Office for Victims of Crime in the United States Department of Justice.

Martha lived in an environment where meaningful work was rare for persons of color and even more rare for those under the age of 16. The lack of funds delayed her entrance into college, however, it was there when Martha began to learn that adversity is not fatal and every person can excel in whatever chosen endeavor on individual merit.

One year after high school, she enrolled and spent one year at Arkansas Baptist College pursuing a major in business, after which, she enrolled in a business college where she completed the necessary requirements to be certificated in general business.

Martha moved to Nevada with hopes of finding better opportunities where she also continued working on her college education. The opportunity arose for Martha to move to California in 1960. It was here in California where Martha was able to achieve her objective. She married and became active in civic and church affairs while continuing to work and go to school. With the support of her husband, she earned an Associates of Art Degree from Rio Hondo Community College and a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from the University of Redlands, specializing in accounting.

Martha House has served in positions in middle management such as Assistant Controller, Division Controller and Corporate Accounting Manager. She is currently operating her own general accounting practice.

Martha House is committed to excel in all her endeavors, both professionally and in community service. She attributes her successes to determination and discipline.

Martha House resides with her husband, Charles in Hacienda Heights where they have lived since 1969.
