Mike moved to Hacienda Heights with his wife, Christina in 1979. While raising their four children, Anna, Amy, Jason and Jamie, Mike was involved throughout the community as a member of the Parent Teacher Association (PTA), Junior All American Football, and most noticeably with the Hacienda Heights Improvement Association (HHIA) where he served on their board for 13 years, 8 of which he was their president.

Mike was appointed by Supervisor Don Knabe to represent the community of Hacienda Heights on the Board of Directors for the Puente Hills Habitat Preservation Authority. Prior to this appointment, he served on the Habitat Authority's Citizens Technical Advisory Committee for 11 years and served as the ombudsman for the Puente Hills Landfill. Additionally, he serves as the Los Angeles County Public Director of the Wildlife Corridor Conservation Authority. He serves as the alternate delegate to Dickie Simmons for the Los Angeles County Fourth District on the San Gabriel Council of Governments and is the alternate representative on the Hillside Open Space Education Coalition. He serves on the Board of Directors of the local nonprofit "Hills for Everyone."

Mike's community involvement has also included serving as past president of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Industry Station Citizen's Advisory Committee and vice chair of the Puente-Chino Hills Task Force for the Sierra Club.

The Hacienda Heights 4th of July "I Love America" Parade committee is honored to have Mike Hughes represent the community of Hacienda Heights today as the Grand Marshal of the 27th Annual parade.

Gilbert "Gil" Adams HLPUSD 1960 - 1997

Gilbert "Gil" Adams was born June 22, 1934 in Amarillo Texas. He passed away peacefully at home, in Rowland Heights, surrounded by family on Sunday, February 23, 2014. Gil is survived by Diane Adams, his wife of 58 years; children Allene, Mike and Maryellen; grandchildren Mandy, Nick, Matthew and Katie; brother Paul; brother-in-law Mike; daughter-in-law Pam; son-in-law Andrew, grand-son-in-law, Michael. He is beloved to them as a most devoted husband, father, brother and "Poppy".

In 1953 Gil enlisted in the Navy where he served in the Pacific during the closing days of the Korean War. He served 4 years active duty as a Navy musician in the 7th Fleet Band, and 4 years in the reserves. While in the service he attended the US School of Music in WA DC. Later he attended UCSB where he earned a teaching credential and BA degree.

A 54 year resident of San Gabriel Valley, Gil started his music teaching career in the Hacienda-La Puente Unified School District at Los Altos High School in 1960. In 1966 he transferred to Glen A. Wilson School (GWHS) where he was the Music Department Chair until his retirement in 1997. Career highlights included extensive traveling with the band to England, Spain, Scotland, Australia, Hawaii, Italy, France, Germany, Austria and Switzerland. The Band had the honor of representing the State of California at President Reagan's 2nd Inaugural Ceremony. They also had the privilege of performing in the Rose Parade on 3 occasions. Mr. "A" was awarded the District's Teacher of the Year Award for the 1975-76 school year. The Band Room at GWHS proudly bears his name.

Gil's affiliations include: life member of VFW Post 1944, the American Legion Post 0291, and the Southern California Band and Orchestra Association. He had a close personal relationship with God since he was converted at age 8. Gil was a man of good humor and great character who never met a stranger. He had a strong appreciation for family, music and education. His tenacity, sense of humor and trust in others was an inspiration to all.

The Adams Family would like to thank ALL of you for the outpouring of love, prayers, calls, emails, cards and visits throughout Dad's time on hospice. He certainly led a blessed life!

Tim Keeler Community Leader—KCAT Production

The Hacienda Heights Community lost a great friend this past March when Tim Keeler, an active community leader died from complications from double pneumonia. Tim was the Director of the Community Access Television Station, he taught Broadcast Journalism for the La Puente Valley R.O.P, was a former President of the Hacienda Heights Kiwanis Club and he was an active member of the 4th of July Parade committee for over 15 years. Tim was a respected member of the community and is missed by many but maybe not as much as his students he had such a huge impact on during those years.

In addition to his work at KCAT, he taught classes and coached at Wilson High School and for over 15 years, he televised the Hacienda Heights "I Love America" 4th of July Parade to the world; not just our community. Ken Manning, longtime announcer of the parade and past chairman of the parade stated he got a call from his son in New York and that he had picked up the parade via computer and was watching as they spoke. Tim made this happen and he brought joy and excitement to many participants of the parade who got to see themselves on Television for the first time.

John Garside, a student of his from Workman High School worked with Keeler since 1998 in local TV production. Keeler often brought in professional photographers and TV production experts to his high school classes.

"He was really open to ideas and letting people do their thing, not censoring them too much," Garside said. "He was just trying to improve the class for the kids. He really cared about them a lot." Keeler grew up in South Whittier and attended Sierra High School in Whittier and Cal State Fullerton. After leaving KCAT Tim went back to his home town of Whittier and continued teaching TV Production and coaching Wrestling.

Tim Keeler was generous and enthusiastic. He was a giver and a selfless leader who was involved in many capacities as an excellent broadcaster, instructor and community servant over these years.

Tim Keeler was truly a community hero.







Conserve Water

Fix the leaks around the house

A leaky toilet can waste up to hundreds of gallons of water each day. Find silent leaks by dropping food coloring into the toilet tank, wait a few minutes without flushing, and then check the bowl for color. If the food coloring appears in the bowl, most likely you have a leak. Be sure to flush the toilet after finishing your leak check!
