#### Grand Marshal 2016



#### Don Knabe Supervisor, Fourth District County of Los Angeles

Supervisor Don Knabe was first elected to the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors in November of 1996 and was overwhelmingly re-elected in 2000, 2004, 2008, and 2012. Supervisor Knabe represents the Fourth District, which is a uniquely diverse area that is home to over two million residents and includes two of the nation's largest economic hubs; the Ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach, and Los Angeles International Airport. The Fourth District is also geographically diverse, stretching from Marina del Rey to the Palos Verdes Peninsula to Long Beach all the way east to Diamond Bar and dozens of cities in between. The fourth District also includes Catalina Island and San Clemente Island.





Supervisor Knabe has spent much of his political career working to protect the innocent and vulnerable children in Los Angeles County. He established the Safe Surrender program in Los Angeles County which allows someone to surrender an infant within 72 hours of birth, as long as the infant shows no signs of abuse. Since 2001, 145 babies have been safely surrendered in Los Angeles County. In 2015, Supervisor Knabe launched a scholarship program to benefit children who have been safely surrendered.

Supervisor Knabe is also known as a national leader on the issue of child sex trafficking. In 2012, he launched a county-wide awareness campaign to spread the word that young girls are being sexually exploited for money right here in southern California. In 2013, he testified on the issue of child sex trafficking at a hearing before the House Committee on Foreign Affairs in Washington, D.C., and, in 2014, he advocated for stiffer penalties for the buyers and sellers of young girls.

Supervisor Knabe is a leader in regional transportation currently serving as a Director for the Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA). Supervisor Knabe is a member of the Southern California Regional Rail Authority (Metrolink), where he serves on the Executive Management and Audit Committee.

Supervisor Knabe has a true passion for the arts and attributes much of his own personal success to an early involvement with music. His enthusiasm for the arts has resulted in the creation of several innovative youth programs, such as the Pediatric Arts Program at Rancho Los Amigos National Rehabilitation Center, and the Arts Education Partnership Program, which provides grants to schools and community based organizations to fund visual art, dance, music, and theatre programs for students. In 2014, Supervisor Knabe announced the start of "Operation Libraries," a plan to invest \$45 million to upgrade county libraries in communities throughout the Fourth District.

Supervisor Knabe is respected for the strength of his grassroots support and considerable experience in local government, which have made him a highly regarded voice, not only at home in the Fourth District, but in Sacramento and Washington D.C. He was elected to the Cerritos City Council in 1980 and served as a Councilman for eight years, including two terms as Mayor. Supervisor Knabe was Mayor during the Cerritos Air Crash in 1986.

As Chief of Staff to the late Fourth District Supervisor Deane Dana, Supervisor Knabe gained invaluable insight into crucial Federal, State and Local issues and the needs of the Fourth District's two million constituents.

Supervisor Knabe is a veteran having served in the United States Navy. He earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from Graceland University in Lamoni, Iowa.

Supervisor Knabe and his wife, Julie, have been married for 48 years. Julie, a Long Beach native, is a past President of the Cerritos Chamber of Commerce. They have two married sons, and four incredible grandchildren!

Romper Room was seen each weekday morning over station KCOP channel 13. For ten years Mary Ann King "romped" through five daily live editions of the Romper Room television show. It was the Kindergarten of television reaching into thousands of homes preparing the pre-schooler for his or her venture into "Big" school.

"It was an absolute joy and delight to walk into the studio each morning and wonder what will come out of the mouths of these marvelous four and five year old youngsters. Every day was different. We may have had a policeman with his motorcycle. A baby deer with a chance for the children to hold it's bottle. We even milked a cow and had a chance to taste fresh milk. We saddled a horse. We hatch eggs. We took "Space Rides" in a dental chair while learning about dental health. The children helped plant a tree for Arbor Day. To see the children use their imaginations was just beautiful. They could easily become a galloping horse, a monkey swinging in a tree or even ride on a rocket going to the moon. They never ceased to amaze me and I loved them every one."



Romper Room originated in Baltimore Maryland in 1953 with Miss Nancy Claster as the first teacher. It was telecast in 82 cities in the United States and 38 foreign countries. Miss Mary Ann hosted the Romper Room show for the "Do Bees" of Southern California. She is a graduate of the University of Oklahoma. She started with the Romper Room Organization in Wichita, Kansas and accepted the position in Hollywood California in 1966. Mary Ann King was a resident of Hacienda Heights for 42 years.



She was the voice of our July 4th "I Love America" parade since it began in 1988 until 2014. She was also Mistress of Ceremonies from 1999-2014 at the Kiwanis Club of Hacienda Heights annual fundraiser "Ribfest" where Miss 4th of July is selected from the three finalists. We were happy to share the joy and spirit she brought to everything she did and are deeply saddened by her recent passing. Thank you for your many years of service to our Hacienda Heights "I Love America" Parade Committee.
